COLLEGE & CAREER READINESS (CCR)

Individuals interested in obtaining an Adult High School Diploma (AHSD) or High School Equivalency (HSE) should contact **252-451-8488, 252-451-8246**, or visit **www.nashcc.edu/ccr** for more information.

College and Career Readiness classes are offered on-campus and off-campus at No Fee to individuals age 16 and older. Minors (ages 16 - 17) must first complete a minor packet and interview prior to registering for orientation.

Orientation & Registration Requirements

1. Space availability is limited and is first come/first serve.
2. Complete placement testing before enrolling in College and Career Readiness classes.

Advisement and Placement Procedure The registration process consists of placement testing, then attendance in a Ready, Set, Go Orientation class.

Ready, Set, Go Orientation

Ready, Set, Go is a required course that prepares incoming CCR students to be successful in the program. Students will be given useful strategies to help them become successful. They will also be presented with career planning strategies to help them work toward their career goals while/after earning their diploma. After completing Ready, Set, Go, students will be better prepared to achieve success in their CCR courses and beyond.

On-Campus Classes

The CCR Department is offering many classes in a hybrid format. Students will complete work assigned by teachers online, and can also attend face-to-face classes.

College And Career Readiness Honors Boot Camp

Boot Camp is a five-week multi-subject course that integrates the Social Studies, Reading, Writing, Science, and Math skills necessary to pass the HSE examinations. Students will attend classes daily, take practice tests in the Learning Lab as the week progresses, and then take the official HSE examinations each Thursday night or Friday morning. Because of the fast-paced nature of this course, perfect attendance, and adequate placement test scores are required. In-person.

Foundational Reading/Writing

This course is focused on building a strong foundation in reading, composition, and grammar. Emphasis is placed on the foundations of reading comprehension, vocabulary development, critical analysis, reading rate, and the composition of clear, organized, grammatically correct assignments.

Foundational Math

This course will develop skills in whole numbers. Upon completion, students will have gained a deeper understanding of basic math fundamentals.

ABE I & II Reading/Writing

This course is a fully integrated approach to teaching reading, composition, and grammar. Emphasis is placed on reading comprehension, vocabulary development, critical analysis, reading rate, and the composition of clear, organized, grammatically correct assignments.

HSE Writing

This course will develop and refine grammar skills and, in the process, prepare students for the essay portion of the online assessment for the High School Equivalency Exam.

ABE Math I & II

These courses will develop skills in whole numbers, order of operations, decimals, proportions, percentages, and integers. Upon completion, students will have gained a deeper understanding of the intermediate math fundamentals.

HSE Math I & II

This course will develop skills in algebraic problem solving including expressions, polynomials, quadratic equations, linear equalities, and functions using workbooks and Khanacademy.org. Upon completion, students will have gained a deeper understanding of working with signed numbers, performing operations with rational and irrational numbers, combining like terms in algebraic expressions, writing and

solving algebraic expressions and equations, solving word problems through the use of algebraic reasoning, and solving geometric problems. Students who complete this course should be prepared to take the Math HSE examination.

HSE Fast Track

Fast Track classes are designed to reinforce skills at a fast pace in preparation for the High School Equivalency exams, including GED® and HiSET®. The integrated content includes targeted instruction in all HSE subject areas.

ONLINE

CCR will be offering online programming and classes to include: self-paced assignments, and recorded instruction. Important information for CCR online:

- Students are required to pre and post-test on campus.
- Students must have reliable internet access.
- Students must be able to check email.
- Students must be available by phone.
- Space is limited, consistent attendance online is required.

Nash Community College offers the following High School Equivalency Tests:

GED®

The GED® test is computer-based. The test consists of Reasoning through Language Arts, Science, Social Studies, and Mathematics. Cost: \$20.00 per test.

HiSET®

The HiSET® is computer or paper based. This test consists of Reading, Writing, Science, Social Studies, and Mathematics. \$15.00 per test for paper-based testing. Total Cost \$75.00. \$10.75 per test for computer-based testing. Total Cost \$53.75.

COMPUTER TRAINING CLASSES

Concurrent (Computer Classes)

A+ Certification - Part I (Concurrent w/ CTS 120- OL01C) | \$130 | Online

This is the first of two courses to prepare students to take the A+ certification exam. This course covers the basic hardware of a personal computer, including installation, operations and interactions with software. Topics include component identification, memory-system, peripheral installation and configuration, preventive maintenance, hardware diagnostics/repair, installation and optimization of system software, commercial programs, system configuration, and device-drivers. Upon completion, students should be able to select appropriate computer equipment and software, upgrade/maintain existing equipment and software, and troubleshoot/repair non-functioning personal computers.

Microsoft Excel (C) - Concurrent with CTS-130-OL01C | \$185 Online

This course introduces basic spreadsheet design and development. Topics include writing formulas, using functions, enhancing spreadsheets, creating charts, and printing. Upon completion, students should be able to design and print basic spreadsheets and charts.

Security Concepts (C) - Concurrent with SEC-110-OL60C | \$185 | Online

This course introduces the concepts and issues related to securing information systems and the development of policies to implement information security controls. Topics include the historical view of networking and security, security issues, trends, security resources, and the role of policy, people, and processes in information security. Upon completion, students should be able to identify information security risks, create an information security policy and identify processes to implement and enforce policy.
