According to the U.S. Department of Labor's *Occupational Outlook Handbook, 2016 Edition*, median hourly earnings for Social and Human Services Assistants were \$15.29. Based on a 40 hour work week, that amounts to \$31,810 per year.

Human Services Technology Program

Human Services is one of the many different types of “helping” disciplines and is a distinct field of study just like Psychology, Sociology, and Social Work are. Many people do not realize that Human Services is a field that is similar to but different from the field of Social Work, just like the field of Psychology is similar to but different from the field of Sociology.

The Human Services Technology curriculum prepares students for entry-level positions in institutions and agencies which provide social, community, and educational services. Along with core courses, students take courses which prepare them for specialization in specific human service areas.

Students will take courses from a variety of disciplines. Emphasis in core courses is placed on development of relevant knowledge, skills, and attitudes in human services. Fieldwork experience will provide opportunities for application of knowledge and skills learned in the classroom.

Human Services Technology and Gerontology Program

The Human Services Technology and Gerontology concentration prepares students to specialize in direct service delivery work to older adults and their families. The curriculum provides both theoretical and applied models for understanding issues of aging.

Course work includes physical, psychological, and social aspects of the aging process; as well as health, wellness, nutrition, diet, exercise, and well-being. Fieldwork experiences provide opportunities to work in a variety of public and private agencies.
