College and Career Readiness classes are offered on-campus and off-campus at No Fee to individuals ages 16 and older. Minors (ages 16 - 17) must first complete a minor packet and interview prior to registering for orientation.

Orientation & Registration Requirements

- 1. Space availability is limited and has first come/first served.
- 2. Complete placement testing before enrolling in College and Career Readiness classes.

Advisement and Placement Procedure

The registration process consists of placement testing, then attendance in a Ready, Set, Go Orientation class.

Ready, Set, Go Orientation

Ready, Set, Go is a required course that prepares incoming CCR students to be successful in the program. Students will be given useful strategies to help them become successful. They will also be presented with career planning strategies to help them work toward their career goals while/after earning their diploma. After completing Ready, Set, Go, students will be better prepared to achieve success in their CCR courses and beyond.

On-Campus Classes

The CCR Department is offering many classes in a hybrid format. Students will complete work assigned by teachers online and can also attend face-to-face classes.

College And Career Readiness Honors Boot Camp

Boot Camp is a five-week multi-subject course that integrates the Social Studies, Reading, Writing, Science, and Math skills necessary to pass the HSE examinations. Students will attend classes daily, take practice tests in the Learning Lab. Due to the fast-paced nature of this course, perfect attendance, and adequate placement test scores are required. In-person.

Foundational Adult Basic Education

The Foundational Adult Basic Education program is designed for students with intellectual disabilities. It serves as an extension of the Occupational Course of Study (OCS) activities in the public school system allowing students to continue their education at the community college level. Students receive instruction in math, language arts and specific career pathways. Through classroom instruction and internships, students prepare to find work in the hospitality and food service industry.

ABE I & II Reading/Writing

This course is a fully integrated approach to teaching reading, composition, and grammar. Emphasis is placed on reading comprehension, vocabulary development, critical analysis, reading rate, and the composition of clear, organized, grammatically correct assignments.

HSE Reading/Writing


This course will develop and refine grammar skills and, in the process, prepare students for the essay portion of the online assessment for the High School Equivalency Exam.

ABE Math

These courses will develop skills in whole numbers, order of operations, decimals, proportions, percentages, and integers. Upon completion, students will have gained a deeper understanding of the intermediate math fundamentals.

HSE Math

This course will develop skills in algebraic problem-solving including expressions, polynomials, quadratic equations, linear equalities, and functions using workbooks and Khanacademy. org. Upon completion, students will have gained a deeper understanding of working with signed numbers, performing operations with rational and irrational numbers, combining like terms in algebraic expressions, writing and solving algebraic expressions and equations, solving word problems through the use of algebraic reasoning, and solving geometric problems. Students who complete this course should be prepared to take the Math HSE examination.



HSE Fast Track

Fast Track classes are designed to reinforce skills at a fast pace in preparation for the HiSET ® High School Equivalency Exam. The integrated content includes targeted instruction in all HSE subject areas.

ONLINE

CCR will be offering online programming and classes to include self-paced assignments, and recorded instruction.

HiSET®

The HiSET® is computer or paper based. This test consists of Reading, Writing, Science, Social Studies, and Mathematics. Paper-based and computer-based testing will cost 15.00/section for a total of 75.00.

COMPUTER TRAINING CLASSES

Concurrent Computer Classes Hardware/Software Support (A+ Certification Part I) Concurrent w/ CTS 120- 1SOL1C \$130 | Online

This is the first of two courses to prepare students to take the A+ certification exam. This course covers the basic hardware of a personal computer, including installation, operations and interactions with software. Topics include component identification, memory-system, peripheral installation and configuration, preventive maintenance, hardware diagnostics/repair, installation and optimization of system software, commercial programs, system configuration, and device-drivers. Upon completion, students should be able to select appropriate computer equipment and software, upgrade/maintain existing

equipment and software, and troubleshoot/repair non-functioning personal computers.

Advanced Hardware/Software Support (A+ Certification Part II) - Concurrent with CTS-220-2SOL1C | \$130 | Online Prerequisite: CTS 120

This course provides advanced knowledge and competencies in hardware and operating system technologies for computer technicians to support personal computers. Emphasis is placed on: configuring and upgrading; diagnosis and troubleshooting; as well as preventive maintenance of hardware and system software. Upon completion, students should be able to install, configure, diagnose, perform preventive maintenance, and maintain basic networking on personal computers.

Introduction to Computers (C) - Concurrent with CIS-110-OL01C | \$185 | Online

This course introduces computer concepts, including fundamental functions and operations of the computer. Topics include identification of hardware components, basic computer operations, security issues, and use of software applications. Upon completion, students should be able to demonstrate an understanding of the role and function of computers and use the computer to solve problems. This course is not intended for a computer novice; this course involves multiple concepts and is a fast-paced introduction to software applications. This course has been approved for transfer under the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement as a general education course in Mathematics (Quantitative Option).

Microsoft Excel (C) - Concurrent with CTS-130-OL01C | \$185 Online

This course introduces basic spreadsheet design and development. Topics include writing formulas, using functions, enhancing spreadsheets, creating

charts, and printing. Upon completion, students should be able to design and print basic spreadsheets and charts.

Introduction to Cybersecurity (C) (Security Concepts) Concurrent with SEC-110-OL60C \$185 | Online

This course introduces the concepts and issues related to securing information systems and the development of policies to implement information security controls. Topics include the historical view of networking and security, security issues, trends, security resources, and the role of policy, people, and processes in information security. Upon completion, students should be able to identify information security risks, create an information security policy and identify processes to implement and enforce policy.

Linux/UNIX Single User (C) - Concurrent w/ NOS 120-B01C Hybrid | \$185 | Monday | 11:00 AM -12:40 PM / Online | Building D | Room 4222

This course develops the necessary skills for students to develop both GUI and command line skills for using and customizing a Linux workstation. Topics include Linux file system and access permissions, GNOME Interface, VI editor, X Window System expression pattern matching, I/O redirection, network and printing utilities. Upon completion, students should be able to customize and use Linux systems for command line requirements and desktop productivity roles

Windows Single User (C) - Concurrent with NOS-130-2SOL1C| \$130 | Online

This course introduces operating system concepts for single-user systems. Topics include hardware management, file and memory management, system configuration/optimization, and utilities. Upon completion, students should be able to perform operating systems functions at the support level in a single-user environment.

Word Processing (C) - Concurrent with OST-136-OL60C | \$185 | Online

This course provides an overview of business productivity applications. Topics may include word processing, spreadsheets, and presentation software. Upon completion students should be able to demonstrate proficiency in producing professional business documents.

Topics include word parts that relate to systemic components, conditions, pathology, and disorder remediation in approximately one-half of the systems of the human body. Upon completion, students should be able to relate words to systems, pluralize, define, pronounce, and construct sentences with the included terms.
